The 2025 Hilliard Distinguished Lecture in Clinical Sciences, sponsored by the Huffines Institute, features **Dr. W. Larry Kenney**. He is an international authority in human thermoregulation in extreme environments, emphasizing aging and other vulnerable populations. His research has centered on human temperature regulation with a primary focus on cardiovascular responses to exercise and passive thermal stress, as well as the biophysics of heat exchange between humans and the environment. His published research has over 29,000 citations, with an h-index of 77. Over his esteemed career, his research has been heavily funded by the NIH and other federal agencies, and he has been very active professionally in the American College of Sports Medicine and the American Physiological Society.
